

What makes somebody eligible for the Migrant Education Program?

Who is eligible for the Migrant Education Program?

The Migrant Education Program (MEP) is a federally funded program that provides support and resources to children who have moved with their families from one school district to another within the past three years in order to find temporary or seasonal employment in agriculture, fishing, or related industries.

To be eligible for the MEP, a child must meet the following criteria:

- The child must be under the age of 22.
- The child must have moved with a parent or guardian who is a migrant worker within the past three
 vears.
- The child must have experienced educational disruption due to the move.
- The child must be eligible for free or reduced-price lunch, or the family must meet income eligibility guidelines for the program.
- The child must be a U.S. citizen, a legal permanent resident, or a non-citizen with a work authorization.

In addition, the MEP also serves children who have been identified as homeless, and youth who are themselves migratory and have moved on their own in order to find temporary or seasonal employment in agriculture, fishing, or related industries.



 Each migratory student must have a Certificate of Eligibility (COE) signed by Tennessee Department of Education to receive services

 If the Outreach and Enrollment team completes a COE for a child, they are eligible for the TN MEP



If a COE is completed for a migratory child in your county/district, you will receive this email automatically from tn.msedd.com

Migratory Qualifying Worker





Migratory Child (MC)?

A child that is younger than 22 years of age and is entitled to a free and public education under State law, and made a qualifying move as, with to join or precede a migratory qualifying worker

Qualifying Arrival Date (QAD):

The date that both the Migratory Child and the Migratory Qualifying Worker complete their qualifying moves together.

The child must have moved as, with, to join or precede the Migratory Qualifying Worker. This date begins the child's 36 months of eligibility in the Migrant Education Program



Qualifying Arrival Date – (QAD)

If the child and the Migratory Qualifying Worker (MQW) moved together,

If the child moved to precede the MQW,



If the MQW moved before the child, ...



the **QAD** is the day they both arrive.



the **QAD** is the day the worker arrives.



the **QAD** is the day the child arrives.



Qualifying Arrival Date (QAD):

The date that both the Migratory Child and the Migratory Qualifying Worker complete their qualifying moves together.



Qualifying Arrival Date (QAD): Both Child and Worker must make a "Qualifying Move."

Special Eligibility Cases

Personal Subsistence

In order to determine if a migratory child is eligible based on "personal subsistence", the recruiter must ascertain whether the worker and the worker's family "as a matter of economic necessity, consume, as a substantial portion of their food intake, the crops, dairy products, or livestock they produce or the fish they catch."



- Submit legible and fully scanned OS with all fields
 completed. If the OS is not legible or does not have these fields, please complete them before submitting


- Submit occupational surveys with "Yes" to both questions 1 and 2.
- Submit occupational surveys with "Yes" and "No" if LEA would like the ID&R team to review the survey(s) to determine if the student(s) can qualify as Migrant.
- Acknowledge emails from the Outreach Team requesting resubmissions and/or questions regarding occupational surveys.

- Use the most recent form from our website
- Upload occupational surveys to the Occupational Surveys
 Tab and save as student Last Name_First Name.pdf
